#### **RURAL SUPPORT SCHEMES**

#### **Expression of Interests 2025**

Expressions of Interest (EOI) are being sought for the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS), Town & Village Renewal Scheme (TVRS) and the CLÁR Programme for 2025. This is an opportunity for community groups to express an interest in projects that they feel would benefit their communities.

EOIs will be assessed against relevant criteria when schemes are announced by the Department of Rural & Community Development. The EOI's will enter a competitive process to be considered to go forward for full funding applications.

#### Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS)

The Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) provides funding for the development of new outdoor recreational infrastructure. It also provides support for the necessary repair, maintenance, enhancement or promotion of existing outdoor recreational infrastructure in rural areas across Ireland.

The scheme invests in the physical infrastructure that underpins sporting and recreational activities based on the use of the resources of the countryside; these contribute to healthy active lifestyles while building on the economic and tourism potential of the area and so are to the benefit of both local communities and tourist visitors alike. The scheme may also provide some limited funding for the marketing and promotion of such infrastructure, typically as part of a wider project involving capital supports.

The Scheme is funded by the Department of Rural and Community Development.

#### Ceantair Laga Árd-Riachtanais (CLÁR)

The CLÁR programme (Ceantair Laga Árd-Riachtanais) provides funding for small-scale infrastructural projects in rural areas. Reopened in 2016, CLÁR aims to support sustainable development in identified areas by attracting people to live and work there. The funding works in conjunction with local funding and on the basis of locally identified priorities.

Tyrrellspass Tidy Towns in County Westmeath are hosting this fascinating and innovative national online workshop on Nature Based Solutions (NBS) for the midlands fully supported by the Local Authority Waters Programme (LAWPRO) to see how local community groups can engage in this space with a localised example in the village of Tyrrellspass and storm water solutions for the area. The workshop will be facilitated with known wetlands/NBS environmental Consultant Féidhlim Harty.

#### WHAT ARE NATURE BASED SOLUTIONS (NBS)?

Nature-based solutions (NBS) for water management are a careful balance in ensuring healthy ecosystems for local biodiversity but also in tandem addressing water related challenges such as surface water pressures, improving water availability, conservation, quality and resilience to climate change by using or mimicking natural processes.

#### ONLINE WEBINAR WEDNESDAY APRIL 2ND

The workshop will examine will stormwater runoff from streets and yards as well as impacts on local waterbodies. We will explore the nature based solutions for natural flood control, drought resilience and water filtration that can be utilised. 




